



#### **Facts about Adult Education in Connecticut**

- In Connecticut, there are 242 program sites across Connecticut offering adult-education services.
- In the 23–24 academic year, about 18,766 adult learners were served by CT adult education programs. That jump marked the first time since the pandemic that adult-ed enrollment exceeded pre-COVID levels.
- Approximately 322,234 adults (18+) in Connecticut lack a high school diploma. Meanwhile, around 4.4% of adults report that they "do not speak English well.


